Wesley Clover Parks endeavours to provide a healthy environment for all participants both human and equine. Through biosecurity proven good practices such as proof of vaccination for entry, our Healthy Horses Only Policy, an Equine Health Attestation, regular stall disinfection, manure removal, the ability to isolate sick horses, access to veterinary care and hospitalization; Wesley Clover Parks has a venue specific plan in place in the event of illness. The following are our requirements in addition to the EC rule for vaccines already in place.

1. Proof of Vaccines: Proof of vaccines must be emailed to <u>stabling@wesleycloverparks.com</u> indicating the horse's **show name** and date of administration of EHV 1 & 4 and Equine Influenza as per Article A519 (see following page for more details). Competitors failing to meet this requirement will be asked to leave the showgrounds or not permitted entry.

2. Coggins Test: Required for all horses on-site and must be available upon request at show management's discretion.

3. Equine Health Attestation: As part of Wesley Clover Parks' Healthy Horses Only Policy, each owner and/or trainer by making an entry attests that their competing horse(s) to the best of the owner/trainer's knowledge have been in good health with a resting body temperature below 38.6°C, have shown no signs of undiagnosed respiratory illness nor infectious disease; and that they have not been in contact with any other horses (away or at their home facility) exhibiting symptoms or signs of respiratory illness or infectious disease within the last 21 days.

They also agree to continue to monitor their horse's temperature upon arrival and twice daily while on site.

Further, all agree to share knowledge of any stabled horses who exhibit symptoms of infectious disease or have had contact with any other horses who exhibit such symptoms, and agree to immediately inform the Organizer by email at <u>entries@wesleycloverparks.com</u> and inform Tournament Manager Tracy Howard at (613)-298-3854.

SITE ENTRY & BIOSECURITY: Overnight security will be on-site. Braiders and any other service providers are asked to report in with overnight patrol and have parking passes (Ottawa Summer Tournament I & II and Major League Ottawa). In addition to rule A519 Vaccinations, biosecurity measures are in place for horses. It is the service provider's (braider, farrier, physio, sports therapist, etc.) responsibility to ensure safe practices are followed if visiting multiple barns. All grooms, trainers, and competitors are also responsible to follow safe practices if visiting more than one barn and are expected to limit their traffic footprint to their own stable area. The stabling is closed to spectators.

NON COMPETING HORSES: Each horse on the property must be declared. Horses found on the property without an entry form will be charged an additional fine of \$200.

WORKING TOGETHER TO MITIGATE THE RISK OF INFECTIOUS DISEASE SPREAD ON SITE:

- Review and ensure you are prepared for quick implementation of an isolation plan at our competition grounds and/or at your home farm or facility.
- Isolate horses at first signs or symptoms of respiratory illness and contact your vet immediately.
- Any horses with a fever over 39C should isolate in separate facilitates on the competition grounds or at separate veterinary facility off-site.
- Keep separate feed buckets, brushes, rags, and tack/equipment for each horse.
- Ask your veterinarian about appropriate sanitizing solutions.
- Eliminate communal or shared water troughs and buckets.
- Practice hand washing in between handling horses.
- Maintain social distancing for horses; no nose to nose contact with other horses.



2024 OTTAWA EQUESTRIAN TOURNAMENTS RULES & REGULATIONS

(A602.1) The Ottawa Welcome 1 and 2, Ottawa Summer Tournament 1 and 2, and the Ottawa National competitions are pending sanctioning as Gold competition members of Equestrian Canada 11 Hines Rd., Suite 201 Ottawa, ON K2K 2X1 and are governed by the rules of EC.

(A602.2) Every class offered herein, which are covered by the rules and specifications of the current "EC Rules", will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. All questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide to the Horse Show Office proof of membership prior to competing. Anyone competing without proof of 2024 EC Sport License will not be permitted to compete. Those without Valid EC Horse Recording will pay the Temporary Horse Registration Fee. This fee is non-refundable upon the completion of the competition. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (A404).

(A602.5) Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

(A602.7) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. Show management reserves the right to refuse entries based on EC rules.

(A602.8) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule will be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, all athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Domestic and foreign coaches must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. Effective 2023, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition,



health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.

- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

(A517.2) The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS 2024

As of July 1, 2023, the Show Office is required by EC to enforce Coach Status Requirements. Per Equestrian Canada's rules, Canadian residents coaching athletes at EC-sanctioned competitions must meet minimum Coach Status requirements as outlined below:



For those who do not meet the minimum requirements, Temporary Coach Status will be available. In 2024, Coach Status requirements will be enforced at all EC-sanctioned events.



Costs of Temporary Coach Status

The fee is determined by the event sanctioning level and the individual coach's EC Coach Status. TCS is valid for one (1) EC-sanctioned event only. The TCS fee will increase annually until it is retired at the end of 2025.

Temporary Coach Status is now to be purchased directly from EC via the MyEC Portal.

Please note: Trillium/OVPSC shows as well as Major League Show Jumping at Wesley Clover Parks are dualsanctioned competitions. This means that those who do not have valid coach status will be required to pay the fine for each EC-sanctioned event that they have students competing in.

Submit one entry per horse on <u>www.showmanagementsystem.ca.</u> Information must be filled in completely to be accepted including signature by person responsible (see EC Rules & Regulations), address, phone numbers, EC, OE, OHJA where applicable and Horse Recording numbers. Incomplete entries will not be accepted.

Cash Only Customers: If you have presented a non-negotiable cheque or a credit card that is declined repeatedly you may be considered as a "cash only" customer. Entries and stall reservations will not be accepted until cash payment has been received. Management reserves the right to refuse entries.

Stabling is subject to availability and may be sold out prior to the confirmation date. It is always advisable to get stall requests in early. Upon reaching stabling capacity, priority will be given to two-week bookings (if applicable). Management reserves the right to reject entries and limit the amount of tack stalls in relation to stabling capacity. Once the Show Office has accepted a stall reservation by email on the confirmation date, stalls are nonrefundable. Stall requests must be made by completing the forms at www.ottawaequestriantournaments. com/calendar and are NOT confirmed until an email is received from the show office indicating acceptance.

STALLIONS

We recommend that competitors bring their own stallion boards. If this is not possible, advance notice of a minimum of 1 week is required and stallion boards will be added to your invoice at a cost of \$250. Stallions must be declared via email to <u>entries@wesleycloverparks.com</u> a week ahead of the arrival date.

GROUND ACCESS & NIGHT SECURITY

The show grounds will be secured overnight. Gates will be opened at 5AM and closed at 11PM. Any service providers (farrier, veterinarian, braiders, bodywork technicians, etc.) are required to check-in with overnight parking staff at gate prior to entering the show grounds and are required to follow all biosecurity practices in place (see Equine Health and Biosecurity).

Early arrivals of any kind without explicit permission will be fined a minimum of \$250 (see <u>Arrivals &</u> <u>Departures</u>).

VEHICLES

All vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. No parking will be allowed on the roads or in the barn areas at any time. All motorized vehicles including golf carts, scooters, dirt bikes, 4-wheelers, etc. must be operated by fully licensed drivers. First infractions will receive a warning. Second infractions will be fined \$250.

COMPETITOR PARKING

Parking zones must be adhered to and will be strictly enforced. At certain competitions, parking passes will be limited and can be picked up at the show office or stabling entry gate. Parking in the barn isles is strictly prohibited. Site maps including parking can be found <u>here</u>.

ADMINISTRATION

- Administration fee: \$120/horse (includes biosecurity, ship-in cleanup and overnight security)
- SMS fee: \$5/horse
- Drug Testing: \$8 for drug tests will be added to each horse's bill (amount to be remitted to Equestrian Canada). Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing.
- JC Levy: As a recognized national competition, an amount of \$20 will be collected per horse entered in the Hunter/Jumper divisions for remittance to the Jumping Committee, in order to support their development programs.
- CAN Jump Initiative: Wesley Clover Parks is committed to supporting the CAN Jump Initiative; therefore, an amount of \$10 will be collected per horse. CAN Jump is a focused effort to promote a sustainable pathway and bring passion to our Canadian Equestrian Team. For more information, refer to www.canjumpinitiative. PAYMENT OF ENTRIES

Open cheques that are delivered to the show office when picking up back numbers will be accepted. Please make cheques payable to: WESLEY CLOVER PARKS. Wesley Clover Parks also accepts cash, credit and debit payments. Accounts can be left open for the duration of the show with a signed open cheque or credit card number on file. Back numbers will not be issued without an open account associated with each entry.

All open accounts must be settled in full no later than one hour after the last class on Sunday, either by paying online or in person at the show office. However, if you do not do so, you automatically agree to authorize Wesley Clover Parks/Ottawa Equestrian Tournaments to charge your credit card for all fees owed. If you dispute a charge made by Wesley Clover Parks/Ottawa Equestrian Tournaments you may not be able to show until the dispute has been resolved. Trainers will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely matter.

A 3% administration charge will be added to all accounts that are not closed by Monday at 10AM following the show and require follow-up communication. A \$50 NSF charge will be applied to cheques that are returned for any reason (NSF fee). Unsettled accounts will be turned over to EC on the 14th day following the show, this may result in suspension from all competitions. A \$50 charge back fee will be applied in the case that a credit card dispute is made regarding a valid charge. **Wesley Clover Parks does not accept e-transfers**.

DELAYS

Delays of more than three minutes may, at the discretion of the organizing committee, cause disqualification of the participant.

ENTRY CHANGES

Class adds and scratches can be made through Show Management System, by emailing the show office at <u>entries@wesleycloverparks.com</u>, or in person during office hours. The Show Office is open from 7AM to 5PM on competition days.

Class adds and scratches must be made by 5PM the day prior to the class. An add at in-gate fee will be charged at a rate of \$10/class for every class added after 5PM the day prior in addition to the entry fee. Class adds made on the day-of may also require the exhibitor to compete first in the order of go. No rider can participate in a class in which they are not entered and will be asked to notify the office and in-gate before competing. Competitors are also asked to notify office and in-gate if they are unable to compete in a class entered. Classes entered but not competed (according to judge's card) will not be charged. A scratch fee may be charged if office and in-gate are not notified appropriately.

ENTRY CANCELLATIONS

- All show cancellations must be made in writing to <u>entries@wesleycloverparks.com</u>.
- Entries cancelled following the closing date that provide 48 hours notice prior to the start of the show (first day of competition) will be charged \$50/entry + HST. Class/division fees will be waived.
- Cancelled entries that do not provide at least 48 hours notice will be charged \$120/entry + HST. Class/ division fees will be waived.
- Stalls are non-refundable after the stabling confirmation date. Hay and shavings are non-refundable once delivered.
- See class specifications for specialty class scratch fees.
- Management reserves the right to assess any cancellations on a case-by-case basis.
- The SMS fee is non-refundable.



PROGRAM CHANGES

The Ottawa Equestrian Tournaments reserve the right to make changes to classes, change the order of the classes, to cancel, reschedule, or combine any division they deem advisable. Any program changes will be posted to <u>www.ottawaequestriantournaments.com</u>, <u>www.showmanagementsystem.com</u>, and shared on social media by 8PM the day prior.

NOMINATIONS & DECLARATIONS

All jumper classes at 1.10M or higher must pay a Nomination Fee.

- Ottawa Welcome & National: \$150
- Ottawa Summer Tournaments: \$175

Exceptions: Schooling jumper classes, registered Young Horse Series participants and jumper classes under 1.10M.

(EC Section A Glossary) Nomination Fee: A fee, usually non-refundable, which is levied by the competitions and, in some cases, organizations sponsoring special competitions such as futurities, to establish eligibility and intent to enter classes or divisions or special events. The fee constitutes a part of the total entry fee and allows the competitor the option to compete, usually upon payment of an additional fee, in the classes or divisions or special events for which the nomination fee was paid.

NON-SHOWING HORSES

All non-showing horses on the property must be registered with a signed entry blank and both owner and rider must provide a current OE or equivalent membership number. A \$100 fee per horse will be charged, EC Drug Testing Fee and JC Levy will be waived. Non-showing horses must abide by all Wesley Clover Parks rules.

Non-showing horses are eligible to enter rings on schooling days only. Any non-showing horse that enters classes and competes will be considered a post entry. All horses in the warm up rings must be wearing their own entry number. Horses found on the property without an entry form will be charged an additional fine of \$200.

SCHOOLING

Rings will be opened the day before competitions starts, weather permitting.

Pre-round open card schoolings will be offered at \$40/round. Multiple rounds may be permitted, time permitting. Schooling Cards will be closed during medal classes. Show Management reserves the right to cancel the hunter schooling class when entries warrant. Schooling classes may be added throughout the week, if time permits.

Riders are required to wear and present your number and horse name to the in-gate before entering the ring.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be credited to each horse's account. Cheques will be made payable to the owner of the entry, unless the office is notified to pay to the rider. Cheques will be mailed within 21 days of the close of the horse show. Cheques will only be issued to entries whose accounts have been paid in full.



HORS CONCOURS

As per Equestrian Canada rules there will be no Hors Concours allowed in hunter or equitation/medal classes. Hors Concours may be allowed in jumper classes at the discretion of show management.

NUMBERS

A back number will not be issued to anyone in a trainer group who has not paid a previous competition or left an open cheque or credit card number when the number is picked up. Every entry must be provided an identification number, which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling/exercise areas as well as the competition rings. Any horse presenting the incorrect number may not be scored and may be charged an additional fine of \$100.

DRESS CODE

Polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper rings during the week unless otherwise noted. Formal attire is required for all stake classes, specialty, and feature classes in any ring. Air vests are permitted and encouraged in all disciplines, judges have been instructed not to deduct points for air vests worn over jackets.

HELMETS

Helmets are mandatory and must be worn by anyone mounted on a horse on the show grounds, with safety harness correctly fastened. It is the responsibility of the rider, the parent/guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to confirm headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards, is properly fitted, and in good condition.

WASH RACKS

Participants are only allowed to bathe their horses in designated areas. Owners who bathe their horses outside of those areas will be fined \$100/incident. No tying horses to the fence at wash racks.

LUNGING AREAS

Competitors are allowed to lunge in designated areas only. There will be strictly no lunging in any all weather footing rings (Creekside, Big Ben/Hunter Warm Up, Hunter 2, Steel-Craft Ring/GP Warm Up, All Weather). A fine of \$100 will be charged to any horse account found lunging in the incorrect rings.

DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

Any costs incurred to repair damage to property belonging to Wesley Clover Parks, including but not limited to stalls, stabling tents, soccer fields, bridges, wash stall fences, etc. will be charged back to the responsible barn.

BLACKSMITHS

A farrier is available during the days of competition. Payment must be made to the show office for all show farrier services. All other farriers must be installed at the designated place approved by management.



VETERINARIANS

All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any bills for veterinary services. Any exhibitor not meeting this obligation to the official show veterinarian(s) may be deemed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

DOGS

All dogs must be on a leash at all times. The owners of any dog that is caught will be subject to a \$100 fine. Owners of loose dogs that disrupt a rider on course will be charged for the entry fee of that class, in addition to the \$100 fine. Owners are required to abide by the "Poop and Scoop" by-law.

CAMPERS

Camping is not permitted on the show grounds. Campers are welcome at the neighbouring Wesley Clover Parks Campground. A limited number of camper spots are available with 30-amp service at weekly rate of \$364.89 +HST (Monday - Monday). Camp sites can be booked directly through the Wesley Clover Parks Campground, <u>campground@wesleycloverparks.com</u>. Bookings are nonrefundable. Wesley Clover Parks Campground does not offer a pump out service; trailer sanitary station is available.

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

 The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES:

 Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

 Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2024: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

 Athletes without a designated coach can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. **When registering for EC** sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are selfcoached, Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A. General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. 77

The CET Mini Medal is to be held under the same rules and regulations as the CET Medal (see Article G1110 and G1111) with the exception of the following:

- 1. Open to riders of all ages who are current EC Sport License holders for the level in which they are competing. A CET Medal membership is not required for the CET Mini Medal classes. In addition, in order for points to count toward a provincial final, athletes must be members of the provincial Hunter Jumper association tabulating points for that region. Athletes may compete in more than one provincial final provided all memberships are in place and they have points as per the CET Medal Regional Final Rules.
- 2. Senior riders must be amateurs as per Article G108 and possess a current EC amateur card.
- 3. Phase Requirements:
 - a) Jumping phase maximum 1.00m
 - b) Gymnastic jumping phase maximum 0.90m
 - c) Flat Phase the counter canter is strongly recommended.
- 4. There will be no water jump in any of the competitions, but a Liverpool is mandatory.
- 5. Eligibility Requirements:
 - a) Riders competing in 1.20m or higher jumper divisions are not eligible.
 - b) Riders may not cross enter between the Mini Medal and the CET Medal class at the same competition.
 - c) Riders may qualify for both the CET Mini Medal and the CET Medal Final, but may compete in only one Regional Final.
- 6. Trainers may walk both the gymnastic course and the jumping course with riders
- 7. Course designers must have at least EC Recorded status.

Overall OHJA Jumper Medal Series Winner will be presented at the OHJA Banquet. Results from the finals will not count towards this award.



The Handy round will consist of 5-7 fences, where pace, brilliance, handiness and a shorter track are to be rewarded. Option fences may be used in either round, at course designer's discretion. Two scores will be given by the judging panel, with one score for the Classic round out of 100, and one score for the Handy round out of 100. The scores will be added together to determine the total score and placement. In the case of a tie, the Handy score will be designated as the tie breaker.
